General D1 Recruiting Process Overview

- 1. Letters
 - a. Swimmers can be contacted by mail Junior year
- 2. Phone Calls
 - a. Swimmers can receive one phone call from the coach in the month of March
 - b. This rule may change
 - c. Swimmer can receive calls after July 1st of Junior year
 - d. Can only receive one call per week
 - i. Call week is Sun. through Sat.
 - e. Swimmer can call coach unlimited amount of times
 - i. Instant message counts as a phone call
 - ii. Swimmer/Coach can communicate through email unlimited amount of times
 - iii. A call with parents longer than "hello" counts as a call
 - iv. Frequency of calls varies program to program
 - f. Personal visits
 - g. Swimmers can be visited once by a coach in April
 - h. Coach can talk with you at meets
 - i. Only at the end of the meet!
- 3. Home visits
 - a. Coach can watch practice, visit family and swimmer at house
- 4. Recruiting Trips
 - a. Official and Unofficial
 - b. Swimmer can take max of five official visits
 - c. Officials offered by most programs, depends on financial budget of program
 - i. School pays for travel, room, board, meals
 - d. Anyone can take unofficial
 - i. School can't pay for it
 - e. Opportunity to see college life, meet the team, coaches, academic advisors, professors, etc
 - f. Coach can make unlimited calls the week before the official visit
 - g. Be responsible
 - i. You are representing yourself, family, team, coach and city
- 5. Signing periods
 - a. There are two signing periods
 - i. Early: 2nd week in November, one week in duration
 - 1. Nov 12-19, 2014
 - ii. Late: 2nd week in April, lasts until beginning of school
 - 1. April 15 Aug 1, 2014
 - b. Pros and Cons of each
 - i. Early
 - 1. Scholarship money is offered to ensure roster
 - 2. Get decision out of the way to eliminate stress
 - ii. Late
 - 1. Most scholarship money awarded
 - 2. Opportunity to go faster and possibly get larger offers
 - c. Scholarship amounts
